NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

Limited to students who have maintained a cumulative GPA of 3.51 (based on an unweighted scale) and exhibit leadership, character, and service.

HONOR ROLL

A minimum of 3.5 on basis of A=4, B=3, C= 2. No grade lower than a "C" will be allowed. A student must be enrolled in five classes for credit to be eligible for an honor roll. Will be released at the end of each semester

GPA

Grades for all courses attempted are used in computing grade point average with the exception of courses marked S/U/P. Courses labeled "H" and "Pre AP" lead to courses labeled "AP" which are followed by the Advanced Placement exams for college credit. Both an unweighted and a weighted grade point average will be reported on the transcripts of those students who took an AP course. The unweighted grade values are A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, F=0. An additional point will be added only to those courses designated as Advanced Placement (AP). The weighted grade values for AP courses are A=5, B=4, C=3, D=2, F=0.

Average GPA for class of 2010: 2.980

RIC

The cumulative GPA is used to establish rank in class. Student grades are ranked numerically. The total number of ranking positions is equal to the total number of students. Both an unweighted and a weighted RIC will be reported on the transcripts of those students who took an AP course.
