But when the bell rings at 3:15, their day is far from over, and the fun is just beginning. After a healthy snack, a quick recess, and a chance to finish some homework, PRIDE begins.

For nearly one third of the Del El community, this after-school program is an enriching, integral part of their school day, and it involves a seven-day rotation which incorporates fourteen different classes. From archery to cooking, math enrichment to drama, robotics to storytelling, the classes are varied and engaging.



The small classes of eight to ten students provide each learner time to experience a subject more deeply, receive one-on-one help from the instructor, and to try something that they might not otherwise have the opportunity to explore. Aside from being a great way to enrich each student's learning, Principal Kizer said that PRIDE has really brought the Del El community together and given teachers the opportunity to become acquainted with students from other grade levels.

ESSENTIAL EVIDENCE

Our newest research is due to be published in 2010. In this five-volume report, A+ Researchers have identified three drivers of successful engagement in the network -- Principal Leadership, Faculty Engagement, and Professional Development. The illustration below shows the potential overlap and alignment of these three drivers. The greater the coherence and alignment of these three pieces, the greater the degree of transformative power within the school. When any of the drivers is not aligned or less present in the school, there is less potential for the great results described in our research. Where can you affect the extent of a driver and its alignment within your school?

The greater the level of engagement in the OAS process, the more effectively A+ brings about sustainable school change.

(This area indicates the degree of transform-mindedness within a school.)
